Message from President

Welcome to the first (new look) newsletter for 2018.

A few words on the rooms: our lease renewal is now at the final stages of the process. The renewal request of 10 years with an option to renew for another 10 has been recommended by the Council and now needs to go to public consultation where the intention to renew the lease is advertised in the local newspaper for public comment. Feedback will then be considered and (hopefully!) the lease approved. We will keep an eye out for that advertisement and will remind members and friends of the WPA when the time comes - positive feedback to the council in support of our continued use of the rooms will be crucial at that step so this will be where you come in....

In the meantime, we are continuing to look at ways to improve service and our facilities: currently investigating new kilns, a slab roller with greater functionality and also the installation of an Eftpos terminal to make it easier to pay for clay, memberships and firings. More to come on those While the rooms have not been fully closed over the past month, the kiln room has been shut down to allow Peter and the crew to undertake some necessary cleaning and refurbishment to get ready for the coming year. I want to thank him as well as the other volunteers who gave up their time to finish those jobs. There is always work needed in that space - without a functioning kiln room we really would grind to a halt - so if you are a user of that part of our club, Peter would appreciate any offers of help.

An outcome of the last AGM was that the committee investigate our fees and fee structure, and come back to members by March with a proposal for consideration and agreement to take us forward in the coming years. To help inform that proposal, we will hold a workshop on Sunday 11 February for our members to come together to explore the background for the WPA and the rooms, and to share what being a member means and what people need from that membership. Tim Foote from the Committee has taken the lead on this piece of work and you will have received an invitation with event details; we look forward to seeing a big turn-out of members on the 11th.

That's it for now. Happy potting and hope to see you soon at the rooms.

Kiln Room News

Blinded by the light? Step into the recently painted kiln room and you will be! All the shelves have been painted and now feature a colour-coded perimeter on each shelf to identify where to place your pots for Club firings....green (greenware – get it?) for bisque, red for Cone 6 (mid-fire) glost and yellow for earthenware glost Cone 02 (1120° C)

Earthenware glaze firings are a *new facility* being offered. Firings will be done when sufficient pots have accumulated to warrant filling either the Cobcraft or FE2 kiln.

Remember though - except for the Club's clear glaze all other Club



glazes are not suitable for earthenware temperatures.



Cool kiln	Monday 13 – Saturday 18 August
Unload kiln (starting at 11 am) & BBQ (noon)	Sunday 19 August

Process

Tutor writes short outline of proposed class and sends to Coordinator, who will forward proposals to the WPA Committee.

- The Committee will discuss and select tutor.
- Dates for tutoring will be offered, discussed and allocated.

Each Class

- Will only be for WPA members.
- All classes are for an allocated 8 week block.
- All classes are of 2 hour duration.
- All classes are the same price.
- All classes start their 8 week block of teaching in same week i.e. term 2 starts Monday April 30 until July
- All classes students pay for all clay and firings.



Note that Friday nights are not available (club night – any tutorials provided on this night will be FREE).

Tutors' Administration Tasks

- 1. Complete the pottery class information sheet and put in Tutor Admin Box in first week.
- 2. Collect Fees \$200 and pay the WPA fee, i.e. \$40 per student, to be paid in the first week of the class
- 3. Get your students to complete the WPA evaluation forms, staple, and place in blue Tutor Admin Box in the WPA Library.
- 4. Reminder......2 hours is to include clean up time.

Ceramics NZ News

A quick update on a couple of things happening right now.

First up, if you haven't already heard, **NZ Potters**, the national organisation for potters and ceramic artists in New Zealand, has just had a year of consulting, rethinking and restructuring and as a result, we have changed our name to CANZ (Ceramics Association of New Zealand) or **Ceramics NZ**. This is to reflect that not all people who work with clay call themselves potters.

The website is now www.ceramicsnz.org. Our fee structure has also changed for clubs and for personal membership. The individual membership has almost halved and provides members the choice to purchase the magazine subscription separately. The club membership is a low base fee plus \$2 levy per member, the cost of half a coffee! Much more equitable than small and large clubs paying the same. Subs are due now to become a member of Ceramics NZ. Download a Ceramics NZ Information & Membership Forms.

Ceramics NZ works behind the scenes. The more members we have, the more support and opportunities the body will be able to provide. Why wouldn't you support this?



Ceramics NZ's new direction will provide all supporting regional clubs access to nationally coordinated visitors and activities. The largest activity for 2018 will be our National Convention and Annual Exhibition.

In August, the Wellington Region is hosting the National Exhibition and the convention which will be focussing on clay surface



exploration. The line-up is already very impressive with 6 professional international and national clay artists committed to sharing their talents: Kate and Will Jacobson (Hawaii) Mollie Bosworth (Australia) Greg Daly (Australia) Jane McCulla (Lyttelton) and Stevei Houkamau (Porirua). Hands-on masterclasses will be held before and after the convention at 3 of the local clubs. The 59th National Exhibition will be held at Expressions Whirinaki Arts Gallery in Upper Hutt while the Expressive Ceramics Convention will run alongside this important event at Trentham Gardens (the racecourse). Both venues are easily accessible by train.

Our website will be updated with registration forms as we get more info. We expect registration forms to be available by mid-February. Those who register for the whole convention will have priority registering for the limited space on the masterclasses, others will be put on a waiting list. It would be great to be able to show off our wonderful region to our visitors. Ceramics NZ and the 4 local clubs have all contributed seeding money to get us started, and will split the profit *or* loss. To make this event even more successful regionally however, we need club members to be willing to help when asked, offer billeting during the masterclasses, but most of all ATTEND! Conventions don't happen in our region more than once in 10 years or so and our team is working hard to make this a fantastic and memorable event, so make the most of it.
